Why we wear RED on Pentecost Sunday:

The clergy wear **RED** vestments to signify the work of the Spirit. It is also a custom in many churches for the people in the congregation to wear **RED** on the Day of Pentecost as well. We wear **RED** to remind us of the fire of the Spirit.

A Note from Chautauqua County Rural Ministry

Dear Friends.

The Friendly Kitchen opened in 1984 serving five meals a week. It immediately became apparent that hunger is not retroactive and people were hungry on the weekends, too. So CCRM began to serve a noontime meal seven days a week. Several decades later, we are now serving three meals a day Monday through Friday and a noontime meal on the weekend.

The Friendly Kitchen, a mission-based program operated by CCRM, serves a very important role in our community providing nutritious meals for the hungry, social interaction, health screenings, nutrition education, cooking workshops, as well as an offsite controlled learning environment for volunteers, placements, interns and community service individuals.

Last year, the Friendly Kitchen and emergency food pantry (opening in 1979) operated at a significant shortfall. However, we were able to distribute 74,440 meals through the pantry and served 34,000 meals through the soup kitchen.

Your support is deeply appreciated and I'm once again asking that you consider having a food drive or monetary collection during the month of April and May to benefit these two wonderful programs.

The response has been tremendous. We thank you, thank you for your continued support in this important project. Honestly, we had visions of baking and selling cupcakes for the next five years!

The week of April 23rd – 27th is going to tell us many things about our projected budget. Once the stained glass windows are removed we will have a better idea of the true condition of the wooden frames and how many will need to be completely replaced. We are still waiting to close on our line of credit at Lakeshore Savings. There will be unknown costs of lawyer fees, closing costs for the loan, memorial plates, and plaques.

Luckily, through your generosity, we have enough cash to cover the payments to our contractors until September. Though it appears that we are close to receiving the three year pledges to meet our goal of \$180,000, the final figure most likely will be higher. We hope that we have enough contingency funding but some of our costs may not be known until we are further into the project. We wanted to keep you updated on our progress and hope this gives a clear picture of our plan.

Trinity Search Committee Report

In April, your search committee received résumés and profiles for five candidates in the latest round of priest applicants. We carefully reviewed their information and interviewed four electronically. Three in-person interviews were offered, two were scheduled and one has not responded.

Since the start of our search we have assessed fourteen candidates, interviewed eight electronically, scheduled five visits, and have had three in-person interviews. One candidate scheduled interviews twice, but eventually pulled their name from the search due to personal reasons. We have had to schedule around Thanksgiving, Christmas, Lent, and Easter, which are prime times for priests in their current parishes, as well as around our own schedules and those of the Vestry and Bishop. This has been challenging.

We called one priest candidate in the first round in the fall. The offer was declined, not because of our parish and our members or what we offer, but because of the region of the country in which we are located.

The search committee has learned many things on this journey, recently the term "discernment." Discernment means "perception in the absence of judgment with a view of obtaining spiritual direction and understanding." We have found that discernment takes time and patience.


It may seem like this search is taking a long time and some parishioners might be feeling anxious. However, we are following the protocol laid out by the Diocese and carefully weighing the prospects. Our parish profile is available on our website and can also be obtained through the National Episcopal Church for any priest looking to find a new parish home. Rev. Vicki Zust, working with transition ministries, has been "headhunting" for us and encouraging priests to apply. Keep in mind, it is a rector's market. There are more churches looking for priests than there are priests available. And, some parishes can offer more monetarily than Trinity. Even with that being said, we know there is someone out there for us, and us for them.

We faithfully continue the search. Thank you for your interest, patience, and especially your prayers!
